PROFILE - ANDREW MILLER


Second at the NZ trailer yacht Nationals

If you hear the name 'Miller' in the context of Timaru sailing you might think of any of the three generations who have been active in and around the club for many decades

Andrew has sailed with the club since he could walk, advancing through the juniors in a starling to represent the club twice at national match racing, then moving to a Finn where he gained top 10 finishes. He has now moved on sail an Elliott 5.9 and has recently come second at the NZ trailer yacht Nationals.



Last Easter the team of Andrew Miller, Raymond Miller and Christan Rasch went to the trailer yacht nationals held at Naval Point Yacht Club. At that point Andrew and Raymond had about a season and a half experience in the boat and Christan was still learning the ropes, but despite this they came a very credible



second place against vastly more experienced crews, some of whom had travelled some distance to complete.

Day one started with 12 knots of breeze and building. It was set to be a great day... until the second down-wind leg of the first race where Raymond managed to break the spinnaker pole. For the rest of that race and the next race he had to fly the kite without a pole but still managed two second places.

Day two, with borrowed pole, started with 12 knots of wind and building into a choppy sea. The team had a good first two races with a second and a third but as the wind increased and chop got worse the boys on the Elliott 5.9 started to struggle a bit and the results slipped a bit.

With Day three's forecast not looking good, 4 races were sailed on day two.



Day 3 (Sunday) blew out as forecast so that was the end of the regatta.

Results; 'Rattle n Hum' first (elder 780), 'Reheat' second (Elliot 5.9... Andrew and team), and 'Forty Four Forty' third (Shaw 750). All and all a great result for the Timaru team.

Ahoy all Captains, crew, club members and others ...


